## UNIT - I <br> Letter, Word, Phrase, Types of Phrases

LETTER: There are 26 letters in English. Each letter is written in two different forms - large and small. English letters written in large form are called Capital letters. English letters written in small form are called Small letters.

ALPHABET: Every language uses a set of letters. This set of letters is called its alphabet. The 26 letters of English alphabet are classified into vowels and consonants.

A vowel is a sound that is made by allowing breath to flow out of mouth, without closing any part of the mouth or throat. A consonant is a sound that is made by blocking air from flowing out of mouth with the teeth, tongue, lips or palate.
$\mathrm{a}, \mathrm{e}, \mathrm{i}, \mathrm{o}, \mathrm{u}$ are vowels and the remaining are consonants.
WORD: A word is a group of letters that has meaning when spoken or written.
Ex. Dog, sky, bat
NOTE:Going with the flow, we discuss below phrases, clauses and sentences wherein we use the words noun, preposition, verbs etc which are explained in detail at a later stage in the module. You may kindly refer them whenever required.

PHRASE: A phrase is a group of words that makes some sense but not complete sense. It does not have a subject and a verb.

Ex. Going to the beach, in the corner
